

Manufacturer Declaration Stockholm Convention on Persistent Organic Pollutants (POP)

The Stockholm Convention on Persistent Organic Pollutants is an environmental treaty, signed on 2001 and effective from May 2004. This treaty aims to eliminate or restrict the production and use of specific persistent organic pollutants (POPs). The treaty was adopted to EU legislation EC 850/2004 and was recast by the regulation EU 2019/1021 in June 2019. Initially the regulation covered twelve substances, but the list was modified and extended.

We hereby confirm, that no listed substances (POP) are actively used in the production of EGGER products and that EGGER fully complies with legislation EU2019/1021.
